The college does not have any institutionalized system for mentoring. However, the teachers maintain close contact with the students. They are encouraged to communicate their problems, academic and personal / financial, to their teachers, without any hesitation so that those can be resolved and they can concentrate on their study. This is, in fact, a regular practice of this



college for a long. Besides, occasional counselling sessions have been organised by the college with the help of professional bodies, viz., "The Centre for Counselling Services and Studies in Self Development" of Jadavpur University, Kolkata, to address psycho-social problems of our girl students. The college has also organized workshops for Career Counselling in collaboration with TCS, Kolkata, Swami Vivekananda Institute of Management and Computer Science, South 24 Parganas, SDM office, Durgapur, etc. to get the students prepared for their placements after completion of their graduation.

2.5.2 Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Class tests along with assignments, paper presentations and projects are frequently conducted by all departments. Previously the system of continuous evaluation was not institutionalised. Under the CBCS system, continuous evaluations are done for all practical based papers. Currently, the system of internal evaluation of 10 marks for theoretical papers and 30 marks for laboratory based subjects are practised in the college as stipulated by the affiliating university.

2.5.3 Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words) It is a long standing practice of this college that every year at the beginning of the academic session of the college the authority publishes the academic calendar and circulates it among the students through the Students' College Diary. These Calendars for 2017-18 and 2018-19 have been uploaded in the college website also. This Calendar contains the class schedules along with holidays and different activities (like Cultural Competitions, Sports, Exhibitions, Social, etc.), celebrations (like Independence day, Republic Day, Teachers' day, Freshers' Welcome, Farewell of Out-going Students, Saraswati Puja, etc.) as well as College and University (as per University declarations) Examination schedules. These schedules are generally followed except occasional changes under unavoidable circumstances.

All Teachers are provided with 'Teacher Planner'. This has been introduced from this year to record the day to day activities of each teacher.

#### 6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (with in 100 words each):

Curriculum Development

The Undergraduate Curriculum taught in this college is developed by the affiliating University. Hence the relevant strategies / policies are adopted by the university and to be more specific by the respective Board Of Studies (BOS). Some of our senior teachers, viz. Dr. Seema Sen, Associate Professor of Physics Department, Dr. Debalina Gupta, Associate Professor of Economics Department, Dr. Dulal Chandra Sen, Associate Professor of Electronics Department are the members of the UGBOS of Kazi Nazrul University and in that capacity they have played vital role in framing the Under Graduate course curriculum.

✤ Teaching and Learning

The teachers of this college use to deliver lectures as per their teaching plans and are keen to complete the courses within schedule time. As number of courses for each subject has been newly introduced, the teachers always take care to provide the students with adequate books and e-learning materials. They also take individual care to enable the students to understand these newly introduced courses.

✤ Examination and Evaluation

Class tests along with assignments, paper presentations and projects are frequently conducted by all departments. Continuous evaluations are done for practical based papers. Under the CBCS system, internal evaluation of 10 marks for theoretical papers and 30 marks for laboratory based subjects are made as stipulated by the affiliating university.

Research and Development

Since it is an under graduate college the students are sought to be engaged in research activities through various assignments and projects as a part of curriculum and process of continuous evaluation. Many of our teachers are involved in research activities for Ph.D. as well as for Post Doctoral researches in collaboration with Universities/ other Institutes.

◆ Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation

Digitization is one of the major targets for the development of the college library. OPAC has already been introduced for easy access to library books. The college has received financial support from P. C. Chandra Group for Library automation in 2017-18. There are two Smart Class rooms to enable the teachers to utilize e-technology for delivering their lectures. The efforts are always taken to keep



#### the Laboratories well equipped and upgraded to deal with the changes in syllabus.

#### Human Resource Management

Teachers are encouraged to organise and participate in Seminars/ Conferences/Workshops/ Short Term Courses/ Symposia/ Orientation Programme/Induction Programme/ Refresher Courses organised by Universities/Institutes/ Colleges to enrich their teaching and research abilities.

Non Teaching Staff are regularly trained to enable them to use MIS adapted by the college.

Students are also encouraged to participate in Seminars/Workshops/Conferences held in the college and other institutions. Workshop cum training programme to develop skills for securing jobs in software companies and separate training for securing administrative jobs are organised.

IQAC has organized several meetings/workshops with Teachers, Non Teaching staff and Students of the college to discuss several aspects regarding development of the college with their earnest participation.

Meetings were organised with Ex-students and issues related to the development of the college were discussed.




