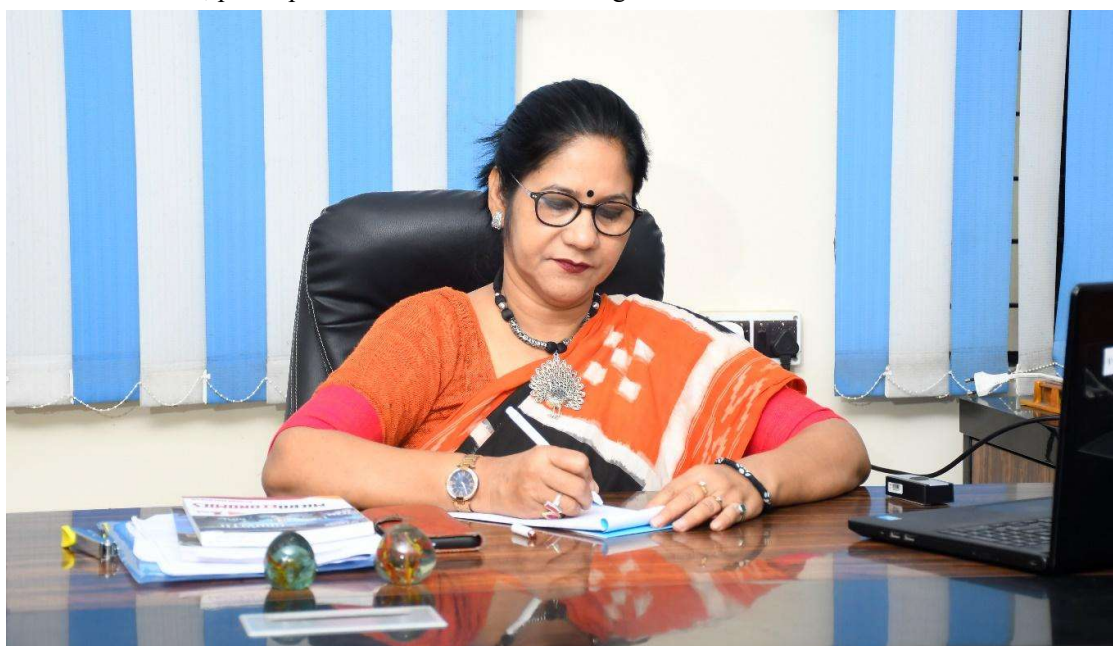

GENESIS: Durgapur Women's College, instituted in 1980, was established as the firstdegree college with the express aim of providing higher education to girl students living in the vicinity of Durgapur Steel Township. The establishment of the college was taken up as a Project of the DNAA (now Durgapur Municipal Corporation). The foundation stone of the college was laid on 5th April, 1981 by



the then Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal, Sri Jyoti Basu. However, the college started functioning from the academic session of 1980, holding classes in the evenings at David Hare Primary School, B-Zone, Durgapur. Durgapur Women's College started functioning from its own premises on Mahatma Gandhi Road in 1982.

STATEMENT OF MISSION & PHILOSOPHY OF DURGAPUR WOMEN'S COLLEGE:

Education is the basis of all empowerment—be it in the family, society or economy. Economic empowerment is crucial for women's social empowerment. A college degree broadens the scope of women's economic empowerment by enhancing their eligibility for jobs in various sectors. Hence one of the prime aims of Durgapur Women's College is to impart sound, graduate-level instruction to girl students. Mere course-work, however, cannot completely prepare a woman to take on the mantle of responsibility in the working world. She has to be imbued with transferable and marketable skills as well. 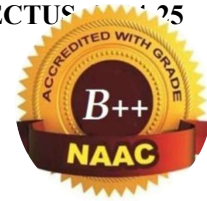

STATUS: The College is an Aided, Non-Government one affiliated to Kazi Nazrul University. The Government, however, has been pleased to bear the expenses for payment of salary only to the Whole-time Teaching Staff, approved SACT and Whole-time Non-Teaching Staff of the college under the College rules of the Govt. of West Bengal. All other expenses, including payments to Casual staff and Invited Teachers, are borne by the college.



ADMISSION: Applications for admission to the 1st year of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(4-year Hons. & 3-Year UG Degree Program) are invited soon after the declaration of W.B.C.H.S.E. results as per WB Govt. Guideline. All applications are to be made online through our website <https://durgapurwomenscollege.ac.in/> or as per the guideline of Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal. The Prospectus will be available through website at the time of confirmation of admission on scheduled dates and time as notified on the College Notice Board and website. No application is sent or received by post. Students from the Science streams can opt for courses in Arts stream (4-year Hons. & 3-Year UG Degree Program) but not vice versa. Students applying to the B.Sc. course with Physics/Chemistry/ Mathematics/Computer Science must have obtained 'pass' marks in Mathematics at the +2 level.

Separate application forms are to be submitted for seeking admission to Arts and Science streams. Upto 3 Honours courses can be opted for in a single application form. Selection for Admission is purely on the basis of merit obtained in the last public examinations. However, for calculation of such merit those subjects will be considered which are academically relevant to the Honours subject of choice. For 3-Year UG courses students can opt for admission on marks basis as per schedule to be put up on the Notice Board and website. Students admitted to Programme courses can upgrade themselves to Honours courses if selected, on payment of fees differences. For Honours courses lists of selected

candidates are exhibited on the website and no intimation whatsoever will be sent to any individual. Failure to take admission on the specified dates as notified along with the selection list will entail loss of candidature and her claim will be superseded by the empanelled candidates. Candidates are advised to fill up the admission forms carefully and upload necessary photocopies of documents as indicated. In all matters of admission, the decision of the Admission Committee will be final and no dispute will be entertained in this context. At the time of admission students are provided a college diary which has to be submitted to the college office within a week of admission for endorsement by Principal. Change of stream for Programme courses is generally not allowed. In extreme cases such a change is allowed on payment of a processing fee of Rs. 10/- only.

Intake Capacity

As per directive of the Kazi Nazrul University seat availability in the different streams of the college are as follows:

Norms of reservation of seats for SC/ST/Handicapped students are strictly followed, as per Govt. orders. Production of relevant certificate from the competent authority is mandatory for availing this facility.

On closure of the scheduled admission time table if any seat(s) remain(s) vacant in the 1st semester UG courses they will be filled up only by deserving candidates who are on the rolls of the College. They will have to apply on plain paper for consideration of candidature within two weeks of commencement of classes on specified proforma. Notice for same will be put up on Notice Board on commencement of classes.

Students are advised to choose combination subjects carefully, keeping in mind their aptitudes and interests. Requests for change in combination subjects are generally discouraged. However, in extreme cases, such changes may be allowed if applied for within twenty days of commencement of classes on payment of normal processing charges. SESSION

Sessions are divided into Semesters of 6 months each. The first semester officially (UGC) begins according to university notification of the year of admission and last semester generally closes on Juneyear. However, final examinations in each semester will be held as per University Schedules. 1st Semester classes generally commence at the expiry of about a month from the date of first admission.



ATTENDANCE AND PERFORMANCE:

All students must attend 75% of lectures delivered, failing which they may be debarred from appearing in College / University examinations. Short-fall in attendance may have an adverse effect on promotions too. **1st year students who enrol for the Major courses but do not join within two weeks from the date of commencement of 1st year classes will have their names struck off the rolls automatically** and their places filled up by students admitted to the UG courses of the college, strictly according to merit.

SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATIONS AND RESULTS

End Semester Examinations are conducted as per university guideline.

Apart from these, class tests are held from time to time and performance in them will have a bearing on Internal Examination Marks (Continuous Evaluation). If a student does not appear at any scheduled examination she will have to explain her absence immediately after conclusion of the examinations, supported by valid documents, failing which she may not be allowed to reappear for her Internals and/or University examinations.

From any Academic Session KNU has been following the Choice Based Credit System and adopted the Semester system where Courses are divided into credits. Evaluation in this system is through a system of grades explained below.



GRADING SYSTEM: Based on the performance of students, each student is awarded Grade in each subject at the end of the semester following a seven-point grading system. The letter grades and the corresponding grade points are as follows:

Students admitted to the college are individually and collectively the Ambassadors of the College.

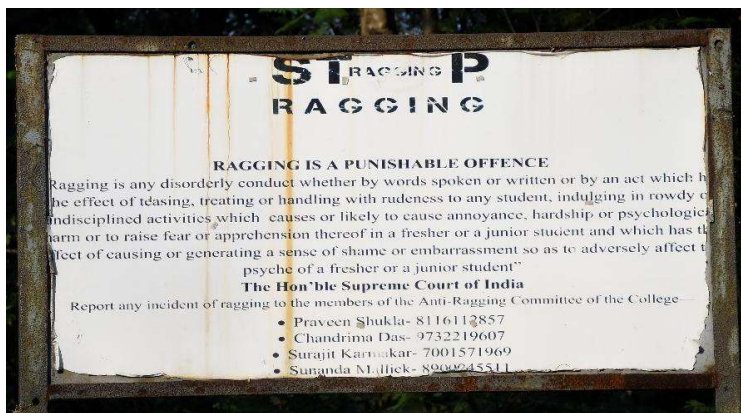


Hence it is their personal responsibility to uphold the good name of the college in their personal as well as public life. Students are expected to dress decently and avoid any show of ostentation on normal class days. They must abide by the general rules of decency and decorum within the college campus as well as outside. They must show due respect to

teachers within the class-rooms, in the campus and outside. They are not to loiter around the bus stands or outside the college gates during or after college hours.

Bringing of cell phones, mobiles and other gadgetry to the college is strictly prohibited as it disturbs the academic atmosphere of the college.

Ragging of junior girls or any other misdemeanour towards college mates will be severely dealt with. Strict action will be taken against those who violate these rules. Students and guardians must specially note that ragging in educational institutions, in any form, is prohibited by law and if anyone is found guilty of ragging she will be liable to be punished under the provisions of section 4.5 and 6 of the West Bengal Prohibition of Ragging in Education Institutions Act. XIII of 2000.



STUDENT SUPPORT FACILITIES

Wi-Fi Campus: The College has been upgraded to become a full Wi Fi Campus supported by Reliance Jio. Students are expected to use the system responsibly and at their own risk.



Library: The College has a well-equipped library with reading room facilities catering to every enrolled student of the college. Students can borrow books as well as issue them to study in the reading



room. Students must abide by the rules of the Library as noted in the cards. Students are expected to use the reading room in their free time. Additionally, all the Honours Departments maintain a Seminar Library.

Laboratory:

The college maintains adequately equipped chemistry as well as Physics laboratory having adequate space. The college has sufficiently equipped Computer Science, Electronics, Zoology and Botany practical labs as well as computer labs.



Network Resource Centre: Internet facility was first made available in the college under the UGC - Network Resource Centre in the 9th Plan. The College has since then made efforts to increase the number of computers whenever possible and also expanded the scope of the Network Resource Centre.



Common Room & Gymnasium: There is a Common Room for students equipped with several indoor games. The Common Room is also equipped with a small gymnasium facility to be used by students.



Outdoor Games: There is ample space within the College for students to play outdoor games and enjoy a healthy sporting life. A Basketball Court, two Badminton Courts and a Volley Ball Court have



been set up for the use of girls. Students are expected to make full use of the facilities available.



Cultural Activities: The College has an active social and cultural life. Different 'days' are celebrated, with students putting up cultural shows under the guidance of the Cultural Committee of the College.

Nandanik

Art and Culture are intertwined. In order to preserve traditional Indian art and culture for the younger



generation, we organise various events for the development of the young artists, i.e. our students at the college. Nandanik is a cell for art & craft at Durgapur Women's College. Here we nurture and showcase paintings, handicraft products, and song-and-dance performances of our students for their holistic development.



Canteen: Canteen facilities are available within the college campus which the students may use at own cost. Students are advised against buying food from vendors outside.



Grievance Cell: There is a centralised cell to look into the grievances related to infrastructure, academics and support systems. The mandate of the cell is to address grievances efficiently and swiftly.



Mentoring:

The faculty of Durgapur Women's College believe in forming a circle of love around their students with parents forming one half of the circle and Teachers, the other half. Parent - Teacher Meetings are a regular feature of college activities. Parents are therefore requested to fill in their Telephone and other contact numbers so that they may be contacted whenever needed, in the best interest of their ward. The system of MENTORING in the college follows a system wherein each student is assigned a Mentor from among the members of faculty. Mentors are like guides who take care of the academic and extra-



academic interests of their wards. Parents are requested to see that their wards meet their Mentor on a

regular basis for any difficulty they may face. If parents so desire, they may meet their ward's Mentor after seeking appointment through the college diary. Parents are welcome to meet the Principal whenever the need arises. However, they are advised to seek advance appointment with her to avoid any disappointment.

Psychological Counselling cell

In today's fast life, mental health issues are very common among students. In most cases, they do not have the convenience of sharing these problems at home and in social circles. On 7th October, 2023, Durgapur Women's College started a psychological counselling cell to help students in this matter.



The primary aim of this Cell is to provide opportunity and platform to students to share their anxieties and apprehensions with concerned authorities. Counselling is offered by trained practitioners and psychologists. The cell guarantees support while maintaining utmost confidentiality about their personal and academic details.

Special facility for *divyangjan* and third gender students

Durgapur Women's College is aware of the special needs of *divyangjan* and third gender students. It has a well-furnished washroom with commode and washbasin to cater to the toilet needs of third gender students. There are ramps to facilitate on-campus movement/activities of *divyangjan* students. The staff is respectful and empathetic towards them. As per the rules set by Kazi Nazrul University, differently abled students are allowed to take extra time and writers during University examinations.



Womens' Cell

Women's Cell seeks to empower and orient women so they can identify their own potential and make a name for themselves in a competitive world. The total development of the individual in all areas of their life is the aim of this cell.

Womens' Study Centre

The Women's Study Centre at Durgapur Women's College focuses on interdisciplinary work on women and gender questions: women's status in developing countries and development issues related to women, the gender dimension of development, divisions of labour, self-presentation, public and private spheres, access to institutions and the organisation of family life. Gender questions are global and understanding of gender relations is essential to comprehend the contemporary world which in turn is contingent upon the intricate interplay of social, cultural, political and economic factors determined in the past.

The primary aim of the Centre is to explore the gendered nature of social processes focusing on development questions. The Centre organises public lectures, research seminars and workshops. These often engage the community, not only the students and the faculty, but also the people around from different walks of life in a conversation to sensitize the questions of gender inequality including violence against women. Along with Women's Cell the Centre aims to provide an awareness on gender related issues in contemporary society.



Legal Cell

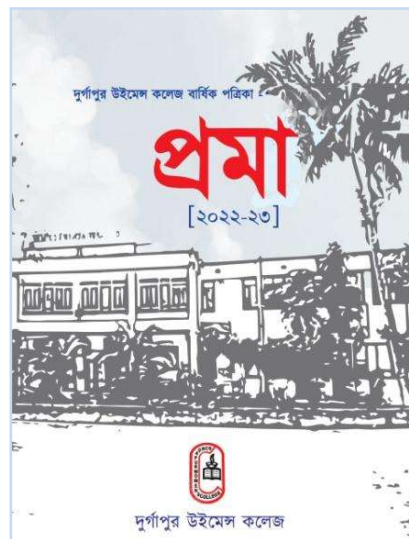
The purpose of Legal Cell is to spread awareness on the laws pertaining to workplace safety and women's rights. It organizes seminars to educate students about anti-ragging laws,



property rights, marriage Acts, consumer rights and cyber-crime. In collaboration with the college's Internal Complaints Cell (ICC), it ensures zero tolerance to sexual harassment of students and staff in the campus.

College Magazine & Wall Magazines:

A college magazine (PROMA) is published annually to



encourage the literary skills of students. Students are urged to contribute quality articles for publication in the magazine within July-August. Wall Magazines are put up by the departments as per roster. This helps to build up the creative and writing skills of students. Departments of Sanskrit, Political Science, Bengali have their Wall Magazines while the Department of English publishes an e-magazine ([MIND BREW](#)) regularly.

HEALTHY PRACTICES

National Cadet Corps (NCC):

The College has a vibrant NCC army wing with an intake capacity of 37 cadets every year. The College unit is under the 5 Bengal Girls' Battalion, Purta Bhavan, Burdwan. Besides earning a 'B' Certificate at the end of two years of training and examinations and a 'C' Certificate after the third year, the students



get to enjoy different types of camps and training like Parasailing, Rock Climbing, Republic Day Parade on Rajpath, the Combined Annual training camp, Thal sainik camp, Advanced leadership camp, National integration camp, Special National integration camp (Andaman Nicobar, Goa, Daman and Diu), Youth exchange Programme camp (Bangladesh), Army attachment camp Panagarh. Earning a

'C' Certificate has many benefits including bonus marks in many service entrance exams and service seniority in forces. The NCC unit of the College is led by a trained commission Officer, Captain Mitali Ghosh Moulick, SACT in Sanskrit, Durgapur Women's College. Hobby Classes:

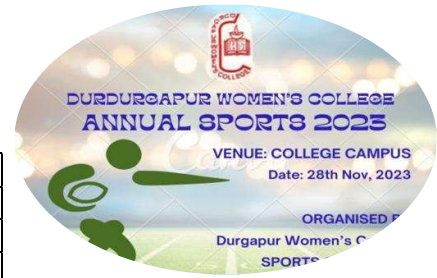

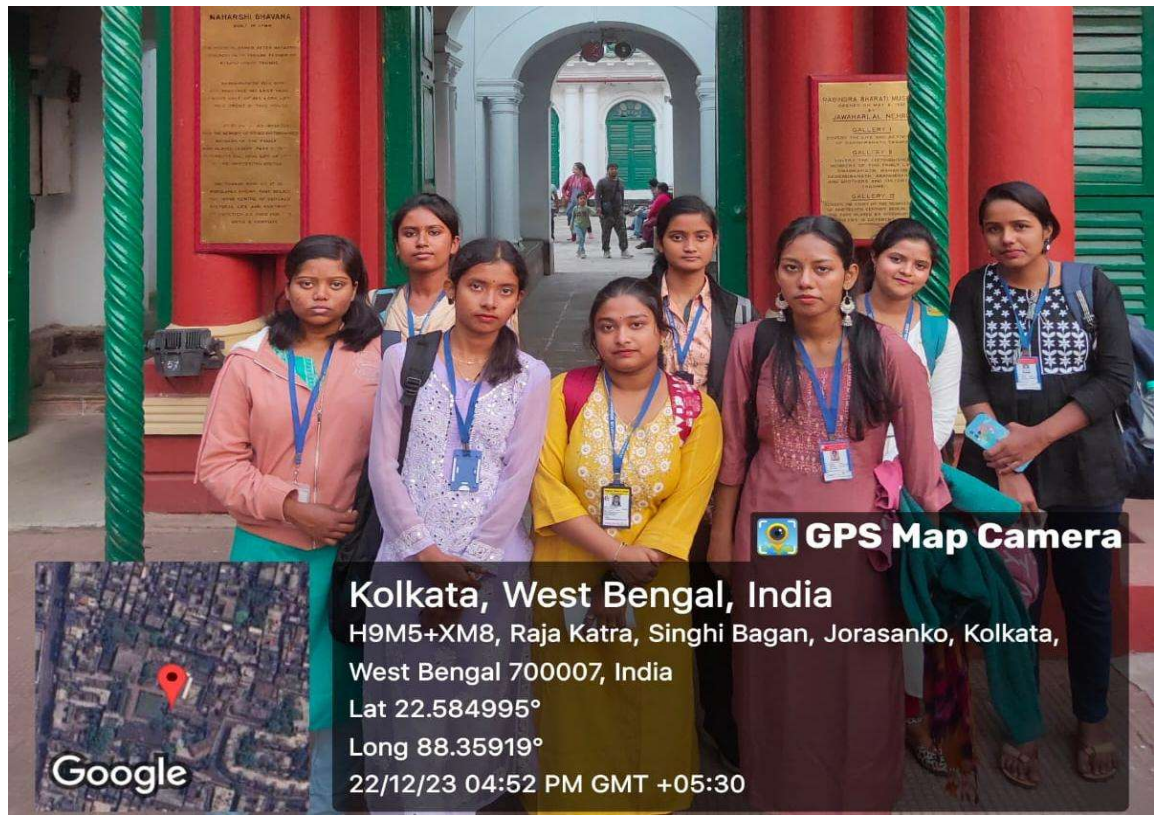
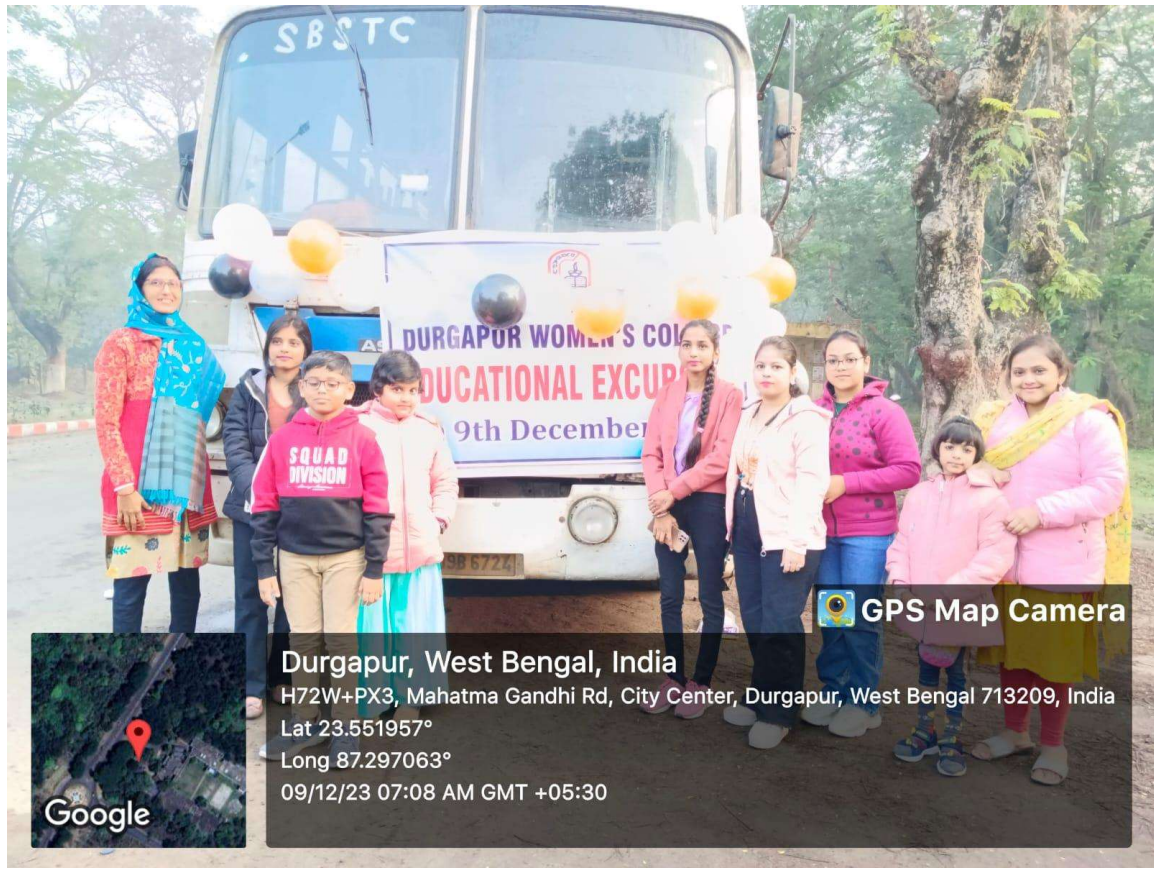

The Film Club

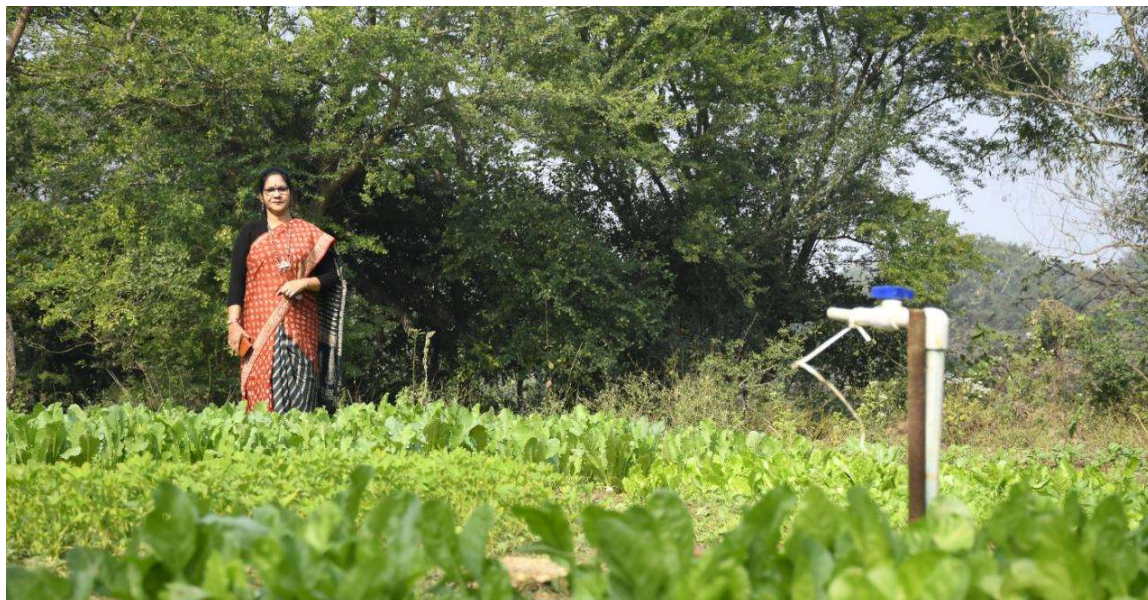
Yoga Club

The courses are designed for 3 levels of proficiency - Certificate level. Diploma level and Advanced Diploma level - each of six months to two year's duration and each complete in itself, including certification.

The programmes are

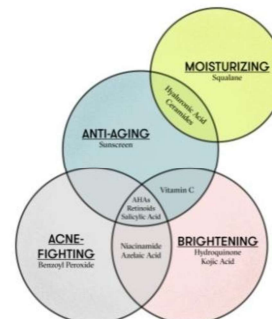
Computer Applications: The course intends to groom students in Computer applications, developing their capabilities step-by-step — from understanding a Computer and its components to learning programming techniques in various languages and learning other varied computer applications. The course purports to hone computer skills in young graduates such that their employable worth increases.



On demand from students the course has been made compulsory for all at very nominal charges. The course content covers Computer Fundamental and Operating System, MS WINDOWS, MS WORD, MS EXCEL, MS POWERPOINT, MS ACCESS, Flowchart and Algorithm for Programming, Programming in C, Internet & E-mail, LAN, Visual Basic, Visual Basic Connecting with Data Base, DTP. Certificates are awarded in association with WEBEL, a Govt. of West Bengal enterprise. Certificates awarded by WEBEL are recognized by Employment Exchange. This programme is being

run under the aegis of the Department of Mathematics where the Course-Coordinator is Prof. Dulal Chandra Sen, Assoc. Prof, in Electronics.

Basic Health and Skin Care Course: The six month hands-on course intends to groom students in personal aesthetics and earn their living in this alternative field. Certification for the course comes from the Vivekananda Bani Prachar Samity. Course cost is Rs.1200/- + Rs.100/- as registration charges. Some students for this course are sponsored by NSPCL. These students will need to pay only the Registration charges.



Advanced Health and Skin Care Course: This course is for those who have successfully completed the Basic course. It will help girls to seek employment in established salons or become self-employed in the field. Certification for the course comes from the Vivekananda Bani Prachar Samity. Course cost is Rs.2400/- + Rs.250/- as registration charges. Some students for this course are sponsored by NSPCL. These students will need to pay only the Registration charges. The last three courses are overseen by the Student Welfare Cell and coordinated by Prof. Debalina Gupta, Assoc. Prof. in Economics.

Tally. ERP9 (CERTIFICATE OF FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING): Durgapur Women's College has been conducting a WEBEL designed special course of Tally, ERP9 (Fundamental of Accounting Principle, Accounting package, Concept and Web based Compliance- Income tax, GST, Soft Skills) since January, 2019. The course intends to train the students in Tally.ERP9 and to develop skills of



managing accounts step-by-step. Certificates awarded by WEBEL are recognized by the Employment Exchange. This is an optional course, given to students at a highly subsidised rate. As an outreach programme and in keeping with our vision of Empowering Women we also offer the course to women candidates not presently studying in the College.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT & PLACEMENT

Entry-in -Services Cell: The College has a vibrant Entry In Services Cell run with UGC support. The cell trains students in public examination skills as well as soft skills. Companies like **TCS, Jio** and other multinationals conduct on-campus recruitment drives and students have been successfully placed. The Department of Computer Science has fared particularly well with respect to placement. The department's students have been consistently selected by **MNCs like TCS and Wipro** and are working successfully in their positions. The Cell is led by Prof. Debalina Gupta, Assoc. Prof. in Economics. Students opting for these courses will be helped with part-time and full-time placements.

All the teachers of the College under the aegis of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell and Entry-in-Services Cell continuously strive to mentor the students of their respective departments in accordance with the current job opportunities and demand for professional skills in the emerging job market. The College has signed an **MoU with Rice Education** in order to arrange free/subsidized coaching and career guidance for the students of the College. Recently, the College also successfully arranged a recruitment drive for its students in collaboration with **CIPET, Bhubaneswar**.



Remedial Coaching



Our College has an arrangement Remedial classes Remedial classes have significantly improved academic outcomes for slow learners, enabling them to excel in their studies. Students are given personalized instruction, which, in turn, makes them ready to take up challenges with confidence. Enhanced academic performance in remedial teaching refers to significant improvements in a student's learning outcomes after receiving targeted support. It includes better grades,

increased comprehension of subjects, peer-to-peer learning, improved study habits, and enhanced confidence in their academic abilities.

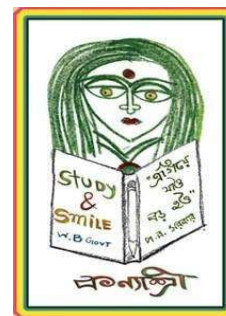


The goal of Remedial Reading is to reduce the number of students who have extreme difficulty learning to read and write. Remedial Reading is a highly effective short-term intervention of tutoring struggling readers in both an individualized and small group setting.

SCHOLARSHIP/STIPEND

Govt. Scholarships :

- a) Students belonging to the SC/ ST/ OBC categories may apply to the Govt. of India Post Matric Scholarships in the prescribed forms available from the office of the S.D.O., Durgapur.
- b) Muslim Students Scholarship - West Bengal Minorities Development & Finance Corporation through the Durgapur Municipal Corporation's Education Cell grants Scholarships to needy and meritorious Muslim Students. Application forms for same are available with the DMC - Education Cell.
- c) Kanyasree Stipend : Unmarried students who attain 18 years of age are eligible to apply for the K2 stipend of the Govt. of W.B through forms available in the College Office.



College Scholarships: Principal's Scholarship for the Specially Challenged.

As a mark of recognition for the immense efforts made by the Specially Challenged students to face the challenges of the mainstream, 3 scholarships -- one in each year of study -- amounting to full payment of college and University fees for one year plus a book grant of Rs. 300/- will be given by the Principal from her own resources to the most meritorious Specially-Challenged student of each year of study in the 3 year degree course of all the In the college taken together. Such students must apply to the Scholarship and Stipends Committee of the college giving all particulars.

Free Studentship: A certain percentage of students are granted tuition fee freeship on merit-cum-means basis. Applications in the prescribed format are to be made to the Scholarships and Stipends Committee of the college within 15 days of commencement of classes as per proforma hung up on the notice board. Applications must be accompanied by notified papers and backed by statement made in admission form. Incomplete applications or applications after due date will not be entertained under any circumstances.

Corporate Scholarships: Neo Metaliks Ltd is a leading name in the manufacturing field and has collaborated with Durgapur Women's College to extend scholarship support to its students as part of its deep-rooted culture of Corporate Social Responsibility. In keeping with their ingrained commitment towards building a strong and progressive nation Neo Education Scholarship endeavours to assist meritorious students facing financial distress in pursuing higher education after completing class XII exams. Students are to apply online through the link available with the College authorities and go through an elaborate selection process, including personal interviews. In 2020-21 seven students from this College have been awarded the Neo Education Scholarship.



Stipends:

A certain number of needy but meritorious students are assisted with payment of University fees on recommendation of the Scholarships & Stipends Committee. No student can concurrently enjoy two scholarships. Any freeship / stipend / scholarship is liable to cease on evidence of any breach of discipline or fall in academic standards, including attendance, of the student.
