#### **Choose ONE Topic from Below:**

- 1. The Theme of Romantic Idealism and its Collapse in "Araby"
  - Explore how the narrator's idealistic expectations contrast with the harsh reality of the bazaar.
- 2. Symbolism in "Araby"
  - Analyze the use of symbolic elements (e.g., light and darkness, the bazaar, the boy's journey) and their deeper meanings.
- 3. The Epiphany in "Araby": A Modernist Moment
  - Discuss the narrator's realization at the end of the story and how it reflects a key feature of modernist literature.
- 4. The Role of Setting in Building Mood and Theme in "Araby"
  - Examine how Joyce uses the drab, oppressive Dublin setting to mirror the narrator's emotional journey.
